

A LETTER FROM OUR Director of Philanthropy

On my desk is a scrap of notebook paper with this bit of inspiration from a 2017 seminar I attended:

“If you want to be satisfied in life, do something to keep the world spinning.”

It’s floating among the myriad post-it notes and phone directories and board meeting minutes and to-do lists that litter my work space. And, at just the right moments, it gets uncovered.

In April of 2017 during my initial interview with Bob Wernet, he mentioned the possibility of starting a charitable foundation here at Deerfield and I thought, *That’s a job for the more seasoned fundraiser, someone with 20 years’ experience and loads of gumption.* And yet, less than two years into my role as Deerfield’s Director of Philanthropy, I found myself reviewing bylaws and articles of incorporation, learning about solicitation licenses and the IRS rules for accepting qualified charitable distributions from a donor’s IRA. As surprised as I am with this turn of events, I’m even more surprised by how happy I am to be working on an undertaking of this magnitude. With the support of residents and the guidance of our very knowledgeable board of directors, I am confident that this work will make meaningful differences here at Deerfield and beyond.

The Deerfield Charitable Foundation has experienced a careful start...which is reflective of the conservative approach that has served Deerfield well for 65 years. Deerfield holds more than \$14 million in charitable gifts and we want to be wise in the way we invest those dollars. Having a dedicated board, a mission statement to guide us, and the input and support of

our residents will allow us to make real differences in the lives of many!

We are following the lead of our residents as they share with us the causes that inspire them. They have introduced us to giving opportunities with local non-profits who are housing, clothing, and feeding the underserved. I have watched as residents did the work themselves – pounding nails on a Habitat House, knitting gloves and hats, building toy cars for children in the hospital, and labeling bags to be filled with food. There’s a unique light that shines from a person who becomes interested in the welfare of others and sometimes, when I’m lucky, I get to see it appear!

A LETTER FROM OUR Board Chair

At the February 2019 Deerfield Board Meeting, articles of incorporation for the Deerfield Charitable Foundation were presented for approval. However, this vote was a long time coming and not taken lightly. Beginning in 2015, with the help of consulting firm Richner and Richner, the proposal for a supporting foundation was introduced.

Members of the Executive Board reconnected with the consultant in late 2017 to further explore such an opportunity. At that time, the Board felt it would take a few more large gifts to accomplish this goal. The incredible generosity of a few residents in a short amount of time prompted the decision to proceed with the Foundation's inception in 2018.

Although it seemed like a long laborious process, legal and financial regulations needed clarification and over the next year we gained a fuller understanding of the practical applications for the particulars of Deerfield. We are grateful to the hard work of Bob Wernet, Robert Chandler, and Michelle Wooley who worked hard to dot every "i" and cross every "t."

Initial board composition consisted of a Chair, Co-Chair (Chair of Deerfield's operating board), and Treasurer. It was determined that board growth would occur once all legal and financial requirements were completed. I am delighted to welcome Andy Strauss, local attorney specializing in estate planning, to the Foundation Board as of February 2020. Andy served on Deerfield's Board of Directors for 15 years and brings with him legal expertise and valuable experience of Deerfield's history and culture of generosity.

In 2020 we plan to add resident members after kicking off an exciting project that invites board, staff, and resident participation. The Foundation Board is thrilled to be partnering with Habitat for Humanity to enrich the lives of seniors in our area. Through the generosity of past and present residents, we have an opportunity to improve the safety and wellbeing of seniors aging in place here in Buncombe County.

They provided a gift of \$750,000 to the Residents Assistance Fund, St. Giles Chapel also received a beautiful gift from their estate. Their legacy at Deerfield lives on through their generosity to this community.

Frank and Emily Stone Mitchell

The Mitchells came to Deerfield on March 28, 2000. Described as quiet, sweet, and unassuming, they were a steady source of kindness during their 15 years here. Frank died in 2015, and Emily a year later. Their gift of \$1,200,000 to the Residents Assistance Fund will support residents in need for years to come.

In November Don and Joanne Brannon, Legacy Society members and wellness enthusiasts, gave a gift of \$50,000 to Deerfield Charitable Foundation, establishing The Deerfield Wellness Endowment.

THANK YOU TO OUR Volunteers

In 2019, three Deerfield residents retired from their long-held volunteer leadership roles.



Loretta Heiser, the visionary behind Bring Love to Tables (BLT), passed the baton to a group of servant-hearted “flower folk” after 10½ years of blessing residents with fresh flowers on their dining tables.



Carl Aufdermarsh and Bill McNutt, volunteer organizers for our daily Meals on Wheels route, stepped away from their responsibilities after seven years of producing monthly calendars and finding last minute subs. There were also quite a few “holes” on the volunteer roster which desperately needed to be filled. Residents responded with willingness to fill those holes and the large empty shoes of these two superheroes.

New residents often remark that, although they’re (mostly) retired and settled in, they are busier than ever! With plenty to do on campus, our community still manages to spread goodness and love beyond the boundaries of Deerfield. Much of that is hands-on. A quick Google search offers innumerable studies touting the wellness benefits of volunteerism, including increased positivity, decreased risk of depression, reduced levels of stress, increased physical activity, and increased mental stimulation. With all of that, it’s no surprise that volunteering leads to less risk of heart disease and lower mortality rates!

Deerfield and our residents continue to partner with outside agencies to care practically for the needs of others. Following are examples of ways that we engage with the wider community:



- Serving meals and fellowshiping with attendees at Church of the Advocate and Haywood Street Congregation and Respite

• Preparing and packing 300 Thanksgiving dinners to be delivered to Meals on Wheels clients across Buncombe County, in addition to weekday deliveries on the Shiloh route

- Tutoring children in literacy with Read to Succeed

• Partnering with United Way to buy and fill backpacks for students across Buncombe County





- Gathering annually, residents labeled 10,000 food bags for Rotarians against Hunger
- Laboring in the woodworking shop to make small wooden cars for distribution through Salvation Army to children in an after school program and children admitted to the hospital
- Organizing community gatherings to cut and roll plastic shopping bags into “plarn” which is crocheted into sleeping mats for the local homeless community
- Serving on countless non-profit boards in our region
- Sponsoring and building homes with Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity



- Working with Project Dignity of WNC to buy, pack, and provide feminine hygiene products to women and girls who cannot afford them

Volunteer Spotlight: **BILL METTS**



In 2011 Bill Metts, Deerfield resident and woodworker extraordinaire, began building small wooden toy cars for the Salvation Army

to give to Buncombe County children in need around the holidays. That first year he produced 125 cars. After learning of a similar need in Henderson County he and a cadre of friends decided to double production and for the next seven years built 250 cars each year. In 2019 he heard about a program at the hospital that gives small toys to pediatric patients. The woodworkers went to work and built 650 cars. Deerfield donates the wheels and axles, Lowe’s donates the wood, Bill and his volunteers donate their time, energy, and care to make a big difference in the lives of children in Western North Carolina.



FOCUS ON Affordable Housing

Partnership with Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity

At the request of Deerfield's Board of Directors, early in 2019 Bob Wernet and Robert Chandler reached out to Andy Barnette, Executive Director of Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity, to discuss a potential partnership. We knew of Habitat programs elsewhere which were actively working to meet the affordable housing needs of seniors. The Board wanted to know if our local Habitat might be interested in exploring the possibilities for a similar program in Buncombe County. Habitat's leadership was enthusiastic and hopeful that a program could be created to serve seniors. Deerfield's Board approved a \$50,000 gift for research and development of a plan for affordable senior housing in a future Habitat neighborhood.

Simultaneously, site development for Habitat's New Heights neighborhood in West Asheville was coming together. This 98 home neighborhood is the largest project in Asheville Habitat's history and it will be the first with homes specifically designed for aging in place. Over the next two years Deerfield will sponsor construction of eight such homes at \$55,000 per home. We are privileged to be part of this new venture and look forward to seeing these homeowners experience the joy of living in a safe place, among friends and neighbors, knowing they have the resources necessary to stay in their homes for as long as possible.

Gift to City of Asheville's Housing Trust Fund

Knowing that affordable housing in Asheville can be difficult to find, Deerfield began discussing a gift that



would assist Asheville in its effort to make housing for low income families possible. Our residents have been largely supportive of finding ways for us to engage with local government and discerning the most effective means of support. In our search we discovered the City of Asheville's Housing Trust Fund. It was created in 2000 to provide a source of local funding to assist in the development of affordable housing in Asheville. Assistance is available in the form of repayable loans at a low rate of interest. This seemed a perfect fit and a gift of \$250,000 to the Fund was approved by Deerfield's Board of Directors and given to the city at a City Council Meeting in October.

Feeding People WITH DIGNITY

Hope for the Hungry: Calvary Food Pantry

Started in 2009, Calvary Episcopal Church Food Pantry served five families on their first Saturday.



Partnering with local churches, MANNA Food Bank, grocery stores, and over 70 volunteers (monthly) they now serve 110-120 families each week. Ever-increasing need and very limited space inspired leadership to step out in faith, campaigning to raise money for a free-standing building on Calvary's property. With a goal to provide at least half a week's provisions per weekly visit, they strive to offer 45%-50% of a family's needs in fruits, vegetables, grains, 25% of its milk, and 90% of its protein.

Leading a group of residents to volunteer, Deerfield saw firsthand the impact this ministry has on so many families in Buncombe and Henderson counties. We learned that in addition to desperately needed food storage and shopping space, a new building would allow for rooms dedicated to prayer, medical checks (a nurse comes monthly), financial advice/SNAP consultations, and bathrooms/showers. After careful consideration the Board of Directors voted to support this effort with a gift of \$50,000 towards the building project.

Help for the Homebound: Meals on Wheels

The mission of Meals on Wheels of Asheville-Buncombe County is to provide hot, nutritious meals to the elderly homebound, thus allowing them to live in their own homes, among familiar surroundings and maintain their dignity while aging. Deerfield enthusiastically supports this mission and is committed to the Shiloh/South Asheville route with our residents delivering meals to clients five days a week. This year, Deerfield asked residents to join an effort to raise awareness and increase charitable giving to Meals on Wheels. In doing so, Deerfield gave \$5,000 to help sponsor the Shiloh Route and residents donated an additional \$4,315 to feed our neighbors.

THE Danny Boone Scholarship Fund

Danny Boone was an early administrator at Deerfield, admired and loved by employees and residents alike. He was particularly encouraging of employees – helping them set personal goals for work and education. After his untimely death in 2000 a scholarship program for employees was established in his name.

The Danny Boone Employee Scholarship Committee interviewed and granted scholarships to 17 employees for a total of \$44,490 in 2019. Fifteen of those recipients were enrolled in a medical field of study.

Geovanna Lopez is one such student, enrolled in a nursing program at Haywood Community College: *"I am forever grateful for the Danny Boone Scholarship that makes furthering our education possible. This scholarship means the opportunity for me to attain my dream of becoming a nurse. My heart is filled with*

hope for the future for every employee at Deerfield. We have the opportunity through the kindness of everyone who contributes to the Danny Boone Scholarship to continue our education and improve our lives. This scholarship program is such a blessing to us all."

As Chair of the Committee for 10+ years, Capt.

Walton Boyer has been privy to countless interviews, listening intently to each employee as they talk about what has inspired them to pursue higher education.

He's also served as the liaison between St. Giles Chapel and the committee,

but in 2020, as the Foundation begins managing the scholarship fund and overseeing the program, he anticipates a shift in his duties. Although he has enjoyed his role, he looks forward to attending meetings as a member, offering wisdom from years of service, and reminding the group of its history and purpose.

In 2018, with the Scholarship Committee's recommendation, the Deerfield Board voted to endow a \$250,000 portion of the fund. Donors responded enthusiastically with gifts totaling \$46,350 to the Endowment Fund. The program's General Operating Fund received an additional \$34,450 in gifts in 2019.

THE Health Care Fund

Deerfield received two large gifts in 2014 and 2015 designated for nursing staff education. Following the lead of these very generous residents, others began asking how they could give to support our employees and residents in Health Care. There was a “wish list” at the time where staff could offer ideas for items and programs that would support their work and improve resident life. Most of these things were related in some way to health care. When donors began giving consistently to fulfill wishes on the wish list it was decided that a fund would be established.

The fund has been incredibly successful in our health care areas: providing dental services, a bladder scanner, and most recently new and updated whirlpool tubs for patient therapy. Brian King, Director of Health and Wellness, describes this fund as a “godsend!”

This generosity not only provides “products” and “services” but, through the purchase of nurse assist lifts, it offers improved workplace safety for our employees in both Assisted Living and Skilled Care. When a gift is given to the Health Care Fund, it promotes our search for excellence as we raise the bar for resident care, employee education, and safe work environments.

THE Residents Assistance Fund

As a non-profit Continuing Care Retirement Community we have the unique privilege of providing compassionate care to residents who need financial assistance or outlive their resources through no fault of their own. This promise offers peace of mind and reassurance as we walk with residents into a future full of unknowns. Since its founding in 1955 Deerfield has offered each resident this reassurance, and for the past 10 years we have provided an average of \$500,000 in resident support and services each year.



A grateful family member shared these words with us after the death of his mother, who would not have been able to live at Deerfield without the support of the Residents Assistance Fund:

“Our last week with mom at Deerfield was both unlike any other and at the same time just like any other...it was the same quality she experienced in all her days at Deerfield. At every stage and level of care everyone associated with Deerfield saw to it that she could live a life full of body/mind/soul stimulation and rich community. As we watched mom move into the later stage of her life we were continually grateful she could face what it meant with dignity and love. That doesn’t just happen as we know. It happens because of a staff team that creates and supports the kind of environment where aging isn’t a time of dwindling meaning but one of facing the challenges and opportunities of these moments with grace and relationship. For all the staff of Deerfield who both understands and lives this out we are deeply grateful. Thank you all for the life you gave to mom.”



The Residents Assistance Fund is often the recipient of memorial gifts and we are so grateful for the families that think to include the fund “in lieu of flowers.” Support from donations and great sales at Sophie’s Resale Shop provided more than \$142,000 to the Residents Assistance Fund. Residents and employees alike benefit from the work of Sophie’s dedicated leader, Bonnie Hull and her volunteers.

A LETTER FROM OUR CEO & CFO

We are amazed and incredibly grateful for the consistent generosity of so many residents throughout Deerfield's history.

Residents Larry and Janet Cable generously made provision for Deerfield to receive over \$750,000 toward our Residents Assistance Program in 2016. In late 2017 we received an estate gift from Frank Mitchell, Jr. and his wife Emily Stone Mitchell, long-time residents who had given no indication that Deerfield was included in their estate plans. The Mitchells gave over \$1.2 million dollars to the Residents Assistance Fund.

Large gifts like these led Deerfield's Board of Directors to establish the Foundation as a separate 501(c)(3) to manage, invest, and match available funds for several reasons – among them transparency. Although we provide annually audited financials, we see the value of offering more detail to the work of philanthropy in our community. The final fund transfer was completed in late January, and as of February 1, 2020 Deerfield Charitable Foundation holds over \$14.6 million in assets. Some of that detail is offered here.

We look forward to what the future holds and how establishing the Deerfield Charitable Foundation will grow our impact for good.


