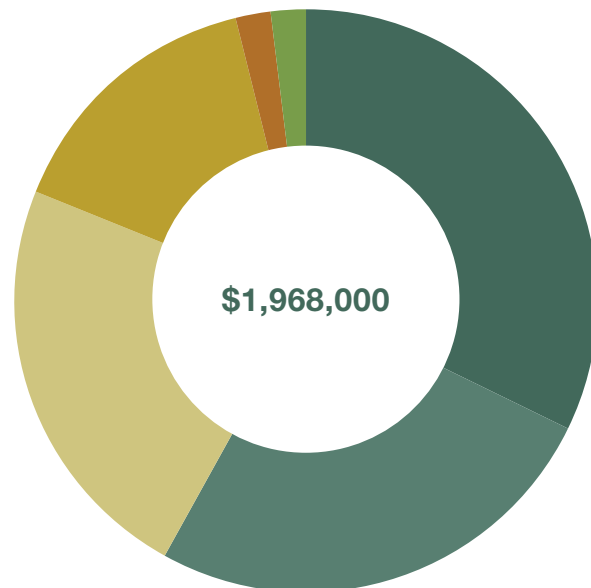

A LETTER FROM OUR *Board Chair*

2021 marked Deerfield Charitable Foundation's third year. It was a banner one despite continued uncertainty and pandemic woes. The work of the Foundation represents the generosity and empathetic care for others that our residents manifest. We do not take this lightly and the Foundation is honored to join with residents to serve others.

The Foundation's assets have grown to more than \$17 million while Social Accountability outlays were sustained at the level of nearly \$2 million. Deerfield residents notably demonstrated their gratitude for a caring, healthy, and safe living environment. Resident Directed Outreach charitable donations were increased this year by nearly 20% compared to 2020. Moreover, dozens of resident households collaboratively volunteered for individual philanthropic projects.

This year we were delighted to welcome two residents to the Board of Directors: Mrs. Joanne Brannon and Mr. Tim Kurtz. Both are engaged and focused on our mission and their roles representing resident philanthropic interests and the needs of the

Asheville community at large. Many thanks to Jeff Covington, Larry Harris, and Andy Strauss for countless hours spent serving our Deerfield Community. And a special thank-you to Michelle Wooley, Director of Philanthropy, who keeps the Foundation moving forward. Her efforts have greatly contributed to and underpin our success.

The Foundation Board's work and decisions were inspired this year by resident input such as the question posed by Jerry DeLand, who suggested this year's Deerfield Cares project supporting Pisgah Legal Service's eviction prevention efforts: "How can I sleep at night, knowing that people's housing situations are so tenuous while mine is so secure?"

It is with enormous pleasure and pride that we report this year's charitable highlights of the Foundation and Deerfield residents. Three target areas of meaningful impact in 2021 were affordable housing and homelessness prevention; health care; and resident volunteer projects. Read on and be encouraged.

NOTABLE GIFT of 2021

Walter and Nancy McConnell moved to Deerfield in the fall of 2010 from a home they designed and built on Town Mountain in Asheville. Mr. McConnell quickly engaged with Residents Council, eventually

chairing the Resident Finance Committee, and ultimately serving as a resident representative on Deerfield's Board of Directors. With Walter's lifelong career in the world of finance and investment, Bob Wernet, Deerfield's CEO, remembers him fondly as lending trustworthy

guidance and a reassuring presence to every meeting he attended. "Walter McConnell had one of the sharpest investment minds of anyone I've known," Robert Chandler, Deerfield CFO, shares.

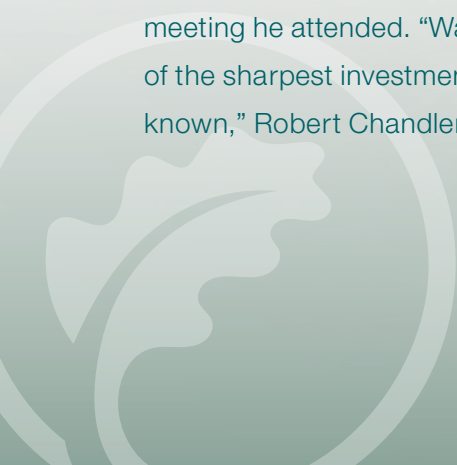
Mr. McConnell was a very generous donor throughout his time at Deerfield, benefitting our campus, employees, and many outside charitable organizations. He was clear about his intention to benefit Deerfield with a significant gift as part of his estate plan. We lost this gem of a man in November of 2019 and in 2021 Deerfield received the gift of \$373,000 from Mr. McConnell's estate to establish a Health Care Endowment Fund. In addition, Mr. McConnell gave \$186,000 to St. Giles Chapel with "special thanks to Chaplain Tonya Hill for all that she has done for us."

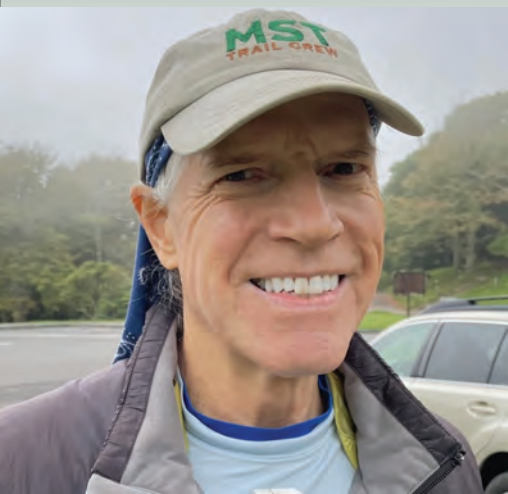

Finding Fulfillment on the Trails

Winning the Blue Ridge Parkway's 2021 Volunteer of the Year award was a huge honor for Mel Skiles but,



with humility, he points to those whose footsteps he followed when he began volunteering with Carolina Mountain Club's Trail Maintenance crew in 2012. Bill Falender

contacted Mel, who had recently hiked the Appalachian Trail, inviting him to consider volunteering with CMC. Mel's experience on the AT highlighted for him the importance of well-maintained trails and, not knowing exactly what he was doing, he agreed to join Bill on the trail. Throughout those first few months while Bill showed him the ropes, he consistently heard the name of a legend in the CMC Trail Maintenance world: Piet Bodenhorst, 2011's Volunteer of the Year and a Deerfield resident. Mr. Bodenhorst joined CMC in 1998, experiencing true camaraderie, friendship and fulfillment on the trails. He began leading the maintenance crew in 2000. Both Bill and Piet mentored Mel, a retired doctor with no trail maintenance experience. Mel learned quickly and is now an ambassador for stewardship and has recruited many volunteers, among them Deerfield resident, Tim Kurtz. Mel and Tim met in Deerfield's

fitness area and formed a friendship. In June of 2021, when Tim found himself freed up from some other volunteer responsibilities, he agreed to try out the maintenance crew. He now looks forward to his weekly days on the trails with others, seeing this work as social, functional/useful, and an opportunity to give back.



CAROLINA MOUNTAIN CLUB is one of the approved Directed Outreach organizations we are proud to support. Many residents enjoy membership in the club, leading and joining hikes, advocating for protecting our outdoors and, of course, maintaining the trails.

Come Walk With Me

Like many, Ann Moorefield and Joan Payton found themselves needing creative outlets as the pandemic began shutting down formerly



dependable avenues of fulfillment. As artists, living on the same floor in Henry Hall, they wondered if they might use their passions and expertise to tell a story of sorts. As a rug hooker, Joan was sketching and

then hooking faces of women from around the world – different nationalities and ethnicities. Ann was writing about the female experience. She expressed joy, embarrassment, regret, strength, friendship, fear, power, and grief – using a poetic voice that is both relatable and transcendent. The finished product, *Come Walk with Me*, Joan's beautiful images alongside Ann's spoken word made an incredible exhibition for our community, reminding us that regardless of status, family of origin, or our life's journeys we share common experiences and deep connections. They encouraged donations to our local YWCA, which actively works for equity and inclusion for women of color.

Equity in Art

Online education was essential in 2021, but particularly complicated for art teachers. Assigning art projects, not knowing if a student has access to markers or a sketchbook or a pencil sharpener was frustrating for everyone. United Way asked if we



might be willing to help support equity for students in local elementary and middle schools. Our long history and experience with United Way's School Supply Drive made this one-time Art Kit Drive easy and fun. Purchasing supplies and organizing an assembly day, residents put together 100 kits in a snap.

Sock Hop for AHope

Director of Marketing Kathy Foster had an idea: let's do a "Sock Hop" to celebrate the coming of spring! Easter was around the corner (bunnies = hopping = feet = socks) and with continued cold weather her thoughts were with those who might need a little extra coziness. Deerfield worked with Homeward Bound's AHope Day Center to find cold feet for 600+ new pairs of socks donated by residents and staff (who received a fun stocking-shaped cookie when they came by with their donation).



The Day Center is a refuge for homeless clients who frequently arrive in the morning to warm up with a cup of coffee and receive practical assistance from Homeward Bound's staff and volunteers.



Sewing Sowers

When the Meys moved to Deerfield in 2020 Maggie thought she'd take a year or two to settle in before inviting her new neighbors and friends to join her in her volunteer work. But, encouraged by a neighbor and Maggie's passion for the project, she began telling everyone about "Sewing Sowers." Dedicated to providing hand-sewn clothes to children living in third world countries, she quickly had a group meeting to learn more and lend their skills to the effort. In the last three months of 2021, 13 people helped produce and ship 201 items of clothing (dresses, shorts, pants, skirts, baby slings, and hats) to Uganda and India.



On the Road (Again)

In the month of May Deerfield residents resumed their volunteer efforts with Meals on Wheels (MOW) in the Shiloh neighborhood. From the start of the pandemic, unbeknownst to Deerfield, two residents ramped up their MOW service and served two days each week throughout. Mike McWeeney and Bob Libbey "did it their way," in spite of the COVID-induced pause we implemented. Now that we're back in the swing of things, more residents are getting involved and experiencing the joy of giving back.



Additionally, residents gathered bright and early on Thanksgiving to assemble meals for 300 Buncombe County Meals on Wheels clients.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY *New Homeowners/New Heights*

2021 brought exciting milestones in our partnership with Asheville Area Habitat. Ann Cox and Kay Ponder closed on their Aging in Place (AIP) homes and board members from our Foundation were there to celebrate with these two new homeowners. Leading up to the closings Habitat hosted Deerfield residents to tour the homes with the builders, hearing from Habitat's Executive Director, Andy Barnett as well as Development Director, Kit Raines.

Deerfield is honored to sponsor eight of these homes in the New Heights neighborhood, for a total gift of \$440,000. Kay Ponder shared her gratitude, speaking on behalf of the first four AIP homeowners in the New Heights neighborhood, "I appreciate that folks

who care about others in their community will make an effort to do this so that I can have a home...

so that Ann can have a home, and Dougie, and Barbara. I think we all feel a tremendous sense of indebtedness to Deerfield for funding this and making sure that we can have housing at a time in our lives when the housing landscape looks pretty bleak in other places. So, they really made a difference. This program really is changing lives."

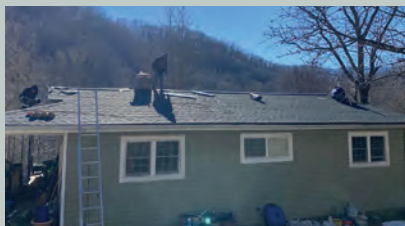

CANTON MISSIONAL NETWORK *Disaster Relief*

Canton Missional Network has been busy responding to emergent needs of survivors since the tragic flash flood caused when tropical storm Fred hit Cruso, North Carolina on August 17, 2021. The American Red Cross estimated that over 750 homes were affected, with 250 structures completely destroyed. Rain gauges along the Blue Ridge Parkway measured 14 inches of rain the day of the flood. The \$25,000 gift received from Deerfield Charitable Foundation has been used to meet the needs of flood survivors where other forms of aid were unavailable or fell short.

Some houses were damaged due to the storm's unrelenting downpour alone. Donated funds provided



supplies and a professional contractor to install a new roof on Steven's home,

whose ceiling began to leak during the deluge of storm water. Many other homeowners received similar assistance.

Other survivors lost vehicles to rising floodwaters.

The Canton Missional Network took on the task



of identifying and purchasing replacement vehicles for those with a

demonstrated need. Scott, whose home and car were destroyed by the flood, recently received a replacement vehicle, which will enable him to commute to work and take his son to school.

Besides home repair work and replacement vehicles, the Canton Missional Network remains engaged in providing for the daily needs of flood survivors. Funds are used to fill fuel tanks, top off pre-paid cell phone

plans, and cater meals at Cruso United Methodist Church when volunteer groups could not be found to cover shifts. "The relief and recovery work being done in Cruso, NC, would not be possible without the participation of hundreds of volunteers from the 25 member churches of the Canton Missional Network and the donations of thousands of individuals and foundations like Deerfield Charitable. PISGAH LEGAL SERVICES *Eviction Prevention*

Jerry DeLand, Deerfield resident, approached the Foundation Board with an idea. He would pledge to make up the difference in resident donations, up to \$50,000, if the Foundation would match the total for a gift to Pisgah Legal for \$100,000. The board jumped at the opportunity to address a pandemic-

related housing issue, in cooperation with residents. The campaign was a success, with residents giving \$52,000 and the Foundation matching that for a total of \$104,000.

Through the program, Pisgah Legal serves low-income individuals and families who are homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness. Most of Pisgah Legal's clients live at or below 125% of the federal poverty line (\$27,150 for a family of three). The gift from Deerfield supported the costs of an attorney and legal assistant who focus on housing stability for clients. Pisgah Legal's advocates worked with clients to avoid homelessness by preventing or delaying unnecessary evictions and foreclosures and to stabilize housing for families by obtaining housing that they can afford. Pisgah Legal's Homelessness Prevention Program provides long-term solutions to immediate problems related to housing. These solutions can keep difficult situations from spiraling out of control and trapping families, seniors, children, and other vulnerable people in poverty. In 2021, Pisgah Legal helped 3,700 people stabilize housing and prevent homelessness.

Charlotte* is a single parent, whose daughter needs a lot of care due to a disability. Charlotte fell behind on her rent during the pandemic. Her landlord filed an eviction despite the eviction moratorium being in place at the time. Charlotte knew to give her landlord the CDC moratorium form, but already had a court date and was unsure how to proceed. Pisgah Legal Attorney Frank Fischer contacted Charlotte after seeing her case on the court docket. Prior to her court date, all NC courts shut down due to a rise in COVID cases. During this time, Attorney Fischer helped Charlotte access financial assistance to pay her back rent. Together, they negotiated with the landlord to renew the lease for at least another six months, providing stable housing for Charlotte and her daughter.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

MAHEC Suzanne Landis Center for Healthy Aging

With a multi-year \$330,000 gift from the Deerfield Charitable Foundation, Center for Healthy Aging (CHA) has been able to expand its home-based

primary care (HBPC) program and establish itself as a regional center for excellence in geriatric care, healthy aging education, and strategies for linking clinical and aging services across Western North Carolina. This year, the HBPC program has provided support to over 140 homebound older adults in our area.

HBPC successes include helping previously bed-bound patients walk again, providing primary care to homebound patients who could not otherwise access care, and supporting the work of loved ones and caregivers. Additionally, this home-based model of care may lead to overall reduction in healthcare costs. Based on initial data, the HBPC team has saved our local healthcare system approximately \$780,000 through reductions in hospitalizations and emergency department visits.

CHA has been busy working to build bridges between the medical and aging services communities, in hopes of improving the well-being of older adults across the region. CHA has also hosted two geriatric summits that focused on social isolation and COVID-19 with a total of 131 participants including physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, pharmacists, social workers, chaplains, and aging service providers. CHA continues to invest heavily in the geriatric education of medical providers, hosting 16 live virtual learning sessions on geriatric care that have supported over 400 participants.

A message from CHA Co-Directors, William McLean, MD, and Tasha Woodall, PharmD:

Older adults in Western North Carolina have had a rough go of it over the past several years. Even before the pandemic, they were struggling with access to clinical care, a scarcity of safe and affordable housing, access to transportation, and other factors that we know help people be as well as possible. The pandemic has only exacerbated all of these issues and contributed to worsening isolation for many older adults, particularly those in communities of color. The generosity of the Deerfield Foundation has been indispensable, giving us the time and support to make this work possible and to improve the well-being of some of the most vulnerable residents in our region.



THE Danny Boone Employee Scholarship Program



Al Nichols, Staff Development Coordinator of Nursing, earned his Bachelor's degree in Nursing and wrote the following to the Scholarship Committee:

I am so grateful to be employed at a place that values the staff as family. As a manager in the Skilled Nursing department, I see the hardships our employees go through, both personally and financially. Following their dreams by expanding their knowledge is the last thing on their minds, but should always be encouraged. Most of the time, finances and a lack of encouragement are the major detriments to success in education. The Danny Boone Scholarship program and the committee provide the opportunity for success for people who take the step to bust through the barriers to your dreams. I am one of your biggest fans! Once again, thank you all. I will never forget the opportunity you have given me and my family.

In FY2021, the Danny Boone Employee Scholarship Committee was pleased to award 13 employees with scholarships totaling \$43,821. Each of these recipients are pursuing education and careers in healthcare.

The General Fund received \$80,747 in 2021. The Endowment Fund received \$37,055, bringing the total invested for future use to \$474,120. Having grown that fund from its initial \$250,000, hopes are high that the community's goal of \$1,000,000 will be reached. The earnings from an endowment that size would cover our average annual need, making the program sustainable regardless of annual giving.

Mrs. Stikeleather's family was so appreciative of the care she received in the health care areas that they requested memorial gifts be made to the Health Care Fund. They asked that we do something special for employees who cared for their mother during the last years of her life.

As 2021 ended, our nursing staff enjoyed a Polar Express party courtesy of these designated gifts. While the celebration buoyed spirits and reminded everyone why they do what they do, the remainder of the donations will be used towards practical needs and enhancements to our medical areas – including equipment, targeted education, COVID expenses, and more.





LEGACY SOCIETY

The Deerfield Legacy Society's intent is to recognize with appreciation and gratitude donors who help secure Deerfield's future through planned gifts. With 30 new members, 2021 brought unprecedented enthusiasm and participation. We were thrilled to receive \$180,000 in charitable gift annuities and news of Deerfield named as a beneficiary in the estate plans of many. Through the years, estate gifts like these have provided millions for our Residents Assistance Fund, inspired the start of an endowment to supply the employee scholarship fund, and dramatically enhanced our healthcare areas. These gifts can be donor-restricted and tailored to meet your philanthropic goals.

The annual gala is an opportunity to gather, celebrating the generosity and forward thinking of our members, with a lovely evening of food, drink, and fellowship.


