Asheville's roots trace back to the late-18th century when it was first settled around 1792. Originally known as Morristown, it was renamed and officially incorporated as Asheville in 1797, in honor of North Carolina Governor Samuel Ashe. The arrival of the railroad in the 1880s transformed Asheville into a bustling hub, attracting tourists and new residents alike. This era also saw the construction of the iconic Biltmore Estate, completed in 1895, which remains the largest privately owned home in the U.S.



By the 1920s, Asheville had become the third-largest city in North Carolina—known for its vibrant arts scene and luxurious resorts. Today, Asheville is celebrated for its rich history, preserved Art Deco buildings, and its role as a cultural and outdoor destination in the Blue Ridge Mountains.

**Deerfield Episcopal Retirement Community** grew from the dream of Rt. Rev. George Henry, who envisioned the creation of a caring community for seniors. His dream was realized in 1955 through a generous gift by Charles and Marjorie Timson, and the community was initially established in the Timsons' eleven-room summer residence on 30 acres of farmland.

Now, 70 years later, Deerfield has grown into a prestigious, nationally-acclaimed, life care community on 125 beautiful acres. 


# **BLUE RIDGE PARKWAY**






### **ASHEVILLE RETROCADE** <


